Current Business

+Financial Report: Tiffany reviewed the financial report. Percentage spent out of budget matches with fiscal year. Report is as of the end of February; some money was taken out in March. Tiffany shared a profit and loss that may change once auditor recommendations are applied. Motion to approve made by Mike, 2nd by Angie W. Motion carried.

+Monthly Expenditures: Tiffany reviewed the monthly expenditures. There is an amount listed under benefits that should be under maintenance. Motion to approve made by Sharon, 2nd by Mike. Motion carried.

+Review and approval of building project-related invoices and transfer of funds. Ayres for \$3150, Journal \$39, Loberg Law \$200, Xcel Energy \$676.11, WE Energies \$1252.28. Motion to approve by Angie W, 2nd by Sharon. Motion carried.

+Director's Report: Tiffany reviewed. Visits are increasing, staff reported it's becoming busier and feeling more normal. Storytime fluctuated greatly in attendance. Pizza Arcade teen night was a big hit. Mystery quilt had 57 people. Indoor storywalk going on in the library now. Next week is National Library Week, and kicks off the passport program. Tiny canvas program running with the school art show. giveBig St. Croix Valley coming up, Friends group will participate. Motion to approve made by Dawn, 2nd by Mike. Motion carried.

+School Representative Report: State tests are coming up. ACTs have been completed.

- +Village Representative Report: Finance committee will meet tomorrow at 3PM about recommendations for bid awards and money transfer from library accounts to the village held accounts to cover the project.
- +Friends of the Library Report: April 26th giveBIG Day. Aware of the fall completion date for the new library. Still working to raise funds through the tractor pull and Cheese Curd Festival. Annual meeting at Summit Park on May 12th, looking for new members. Warren Enger's celebration of life is June 4th.
- +Building Project Update: Groundbreaking can happen as a wall smashing with representatives from the project in April; library to receive a grant that is dependent on it. Some repair to exterior doors needed, furnishings, landscaping, moving expenses, and window treatments are not going to be in the construction budget.
- +Discussion of payment of utilities at 388 W Main Street: Auditor suggested that the utilities come out of the library operating budget during construction rather than construction budget, then transfer funds to cover expenses.

New Business

- +Presentation and possible action re: Ellsworth Public Library Logo. The staff and board were approached with several options for a new library logo and came to a consensus on a blue and green color scheme. A black and white version is also available for print. Once officially approved the logo will begin to be used in business cards, etc. Motion to approve by Angie W, 2nd by Sharon. Motion carried.
- +Discussion and possible action re: Exterior signage, digital signage, and donor wall for new library building. These items are not included in the building project budget. Vendors are starting to reach out for these things. At some point the board and building committee will need to decide how to handle these aspects of the project. No action at this time.
- + Discussion and approval of library policy revisions: Revised policy was presented to the board with new items highlighted. Added to the policy was the photography and videography policy, policy re: animals in the library, and a diversity statement in the collection development section. Recommended to increase color copies to \$.50 up from \$.25. Black and white copies to remain at \$.10. Motion to approve by Sharon, 2nd by Mike. Motion carried.
